Guidelines for Authors Indetec Aegiptus Journal of Egyptology (IAJE)

The IAJE is an electronic journal of Egyptology that was established in 2005 to foster research in Egyptology beside history, languages, social systems and archaeology of ancient Egypt.

INDETEC-Aegiptus Jounal of Egyptology is an academic magazine where the results of the investigations carried out in the International Institute of Egyptology - INDETEC-Aegiptus are published. We are either open to investigations or papers of those people that desire to contribute with the results of their own investigations in the matters that covers our Institute.

The journal is edited twice a year publishing scholarly research on all periods and technical aspects of Egyptian civilization, not only by Egyptologists but also by researches in other more technical fields, who can contribute to throw light on the life of the ancient Egyptian people. Multidisciplinarity and interdisciplinarity research in Egyptology.

The IAJE publishes all research written in Spanish, English, German or French.

Submission of manuscripts

The submission should include an abstract of not more than 250 words.

General Matters of Style

Manuscripts should be composed:

- as MS Word document.
- in 10-point type and Arial Font.
- please use single word space between sentences
- footnotes are required

Illustrations

Illustrations (line drawings, colour or black and white photographs) accompanying submissions should be sent on CD-ROM or by e-mail as attachment as .jpg or .tiff files.

All illustrations should be clearly labeled. Please number all illustrations and include a list of captions, including credits. Authors are responsible for obtaining formal permissions and paying fees for reproduction.

Bibliography

Bibliography must be at the end of the manuscript, so in footnotes citations must be like BASADE II (2004), pág 5-10 or Obsomer (1995), pág. 145-152.

Review and evaluation of manuscripts

Manuscripts are submitted to Scientific Committee of the INDETEC-Aegiptus for its evaluation. Committee evaluate the manuscript on the basis of several criteria, including quality of scholarship, documentation, and its contribution to research in the field.

The reviewers' evaluations of the manuscript, and their recommendations – to publish, not to publish, or to publish subject to revision – will be conveyed to authors by the journal's editor.

If a manuscript is accepted for publication, the editor may suggest substantive or stylistic changes or query particular elements of the article, and send it to the authors for review and revision. This is the last opportunity for authors to make substantial revisions to their articles. On completion of these revisions, the manuscripts can be sent by the same way to the editor (i.e. CD-Rom and paper by postal mail, or as an attachment by e-mail), generally within one month of the author's receipt of the edited manuscript.

Once the manuscript is final, the editor sends it to IAJE's compositor, which typesets and lays out the text and its illustrations.
